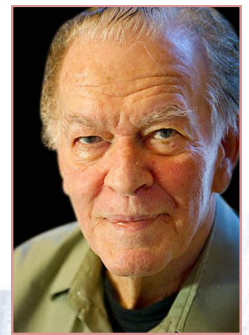

## How to Start a Revolution

*A film about nonviolent activism with discussion led by Lee Smithey*

This award-winning film profiles Gene Sharp, an octogenarian academic who has devoted his life to studying nonviolent group action in bringing social and political change and making that research widely available. It introduces us to his ally Retired U.S. Army Colonel Robert Helvey, who has used Gene's methods to train activists the world over, and to a number of key leaders of nonviolent revolutions who testify to the power of Gene's work in practice. The film is illustrated throughout with user-generated content of protesters and activists filmed on mobile phones in the street in Egypt, Tunisia, Iran, Serbia, and elsewhere.
